Stop Climate Chaos Scotland would like to thank you for taking part. Together we have a strong and clear voice on climate change.

It's December, and the international climate change talks in Copenhagen are finally upon us. We have a clear message for our UK political leaders. We want them to:

Share Scotland's ambition

Earlier this year, the Scottish Parliament passed the most progressive climate change legislation in the world. We want the UK government to ensure that developed nations commit to at least the same ambition as Scotland.

Protect the poorest

The world's poorest people are being hit first and worst because of emissions produced by rich countries, including the UK. We call on the UK Government to provide our fair share of additional resources that are needed to help people in poor countries adapt to climate change and establish low carbon energy sources.

Act fair and fast

The UK has a historical responsibility for climate change and we need to make deep cuts in our emissions straight away. The UK must commit to reducing its carbon emissions by at least 42% by 2020 through and call on other rich countries to do the same.

Key information for the day

- **The march starts from Bellahouston Park** and we will gather there from **10.30am**. The march will begin at 11am.
- **Dress for the weather.** You will be on the march for at least an hour and the weather may vary along the route, so make sure you can keep warm and dry.
- **Check you know your travel plans.** There is plenty of public transport to Bellahouston Park. See overleaf for details.
- **Bring your family and friends...**
- **But not your pets!** Large crowds can be distressing for animals and for their own safety it is best they stay at home.
- **If you have children with you,** please keep them beside you at all times and hold small children by the hand. This is especially important during the march itself when we will be walking on the road. If you have a mobile telephone, please ensure your children have the number with them.
- **Listen to the Stewards.** Our volunteer stewards are here to help and make sure our event is a success. Please do as they ask.
- **At Kelvingrove Park** there will be lots going on with speakers and music for you to listen to, an opportunity for you to find out more about the climate change work of coalition members, and a Kids Tent with face-painting and kite-making.
- **Enjoy yourself!** The Wave is a fun and family-friendly event so enjoy yourself and help keep everyone safe.

Transport within Glasgow

We encourage everyone attending this event to make their way by public transport. To help, here are all the details you need to know:

Buses

There are various bus routes from the city centre to the Bellahouston Park. Glasgow Queen Street and Glasgow Central railway stations and Buchanan Bus Station are all only a few minutes walk from these bus routes:

- First Glasgow Buses: number 3 from Renfield Street or numbers 9, 54 and 56 from Union Street.
- Arriva buses: number 36 from Union Street.
- All of these buses travel along Paisley Road West. Get off at the first stop after you cross the M8 motorway, this is the 'Palace of Art' bus stop.

Subway

If you are arriving in Glasgow by train at Queen Street Railway Station or by bus at Buchanan Bus Station, take the subway from Buchanan Street. If you are arriving by train at Central Station, take the subway from St Enoch. Get off at Ibrox subway station, turn right when you come out of the station and walk to the end of Copland Road, then turn right onto Paisley Road West.

Cycling

The park forms part of the Glasgow to Irvine and Ardrossan Cycle Route (Number 75).

Walking access to the park

Bellahouston Park can be accessed from Dumbreck Road, Paisley Road West, Bellahouston Drive and Mossspark Boulevard.

When you arrive at Bellahouston Park, look out for the stewards who will direct you to the start of the march.
