Job information

Job purpose

Coordinating the FoES youth network, supporting a network of volunteers across Scotland working on a range of environmental and social justice issues, coordinating the delivery of high-quality events, maintaining communication channels and supporting the growth of the network. (3 days a week).

Support FoES movement building work by assisting with events, campaign development and delivery where necessary. (1 day a week)

Location

Based in Edinburgh (at least 1 day per week) with hybrid working arrangements. Other arrangements for people based elsewhere in Scotland is possible by negotiation. You will also be expected to undertake some travel around Scotland in the course of your work.

Team

Working as part of the Movement Building Team and you will report to the Movement Building Lead

Hours

This is a permanent post, 4 days per week

Salary & Benefits

£30'000-£35'000 (Full-time equivalent)

You will receive a pro-rata share of 28 days annual leave and 11 days statutory holidays.

Friends of the Earth Scotland is Scotland's leading environmental campaigning group, working to help people in Scotland look after the planet for everyone's future.

Our vision

Hope

Our vision is a vision of a possible world, and that we can act in the here and now to create changes that make that world more likely. In acting on this hope, we do not ignore the enormous environmental losses that have already occurred, the likelihood that many more will occur, or the magnitude of the systemic transformations that are needed to bring our vision about;

Collaboration

We see ourselves as one part of a wide, diverse ecosystem working for transformative solutions to environmental problems. At every level, from our staff team and our Board to the FoEI network, our membership, and our external partners, we work in generous partnership and in support of democratic participation

Creativity

Defending against attack is necessary but insufficient in achieving our organisational vision: we need new relations and systems linking people and ecosystems to do that. Developing these systems is the work of creating as well as dismantling, and we will hold space for creativity in our internal and external work

Care

Care requires systemic measures that recognise the capacities and limitations of people and ecosystems, as well as individual attitudes of kindness and concern. Our internal operations, our interactions with partners, and our campaigning goals will be oriented by care for people and planet

Justice

Environmental and social harms are disproportionately caused by systems of domination and extraction developed by the elites of majority white countries in the global North, and are disproportionately felt among people who are economically, socially, and racially marginalised in the global North and South. We act in solidarity with the people most affected by environmental harms in our campaigning for transformative solutions, and we work to centre fairness and anti-oppression in our internal systems and processes

Integrity

We understand our values as things we hold and things we do. We put them into practice across our internal and external activities, and we reflect and reorient when we fall short of them.

About this role

This role requires strong interpersonal and communication skills as it requires working with and supporting a network of volunteers. The ability to work collaboratively and sensitively is essential, as is a commitment to supporting and empowering young people to make decisions and develop their skills as our network is youth-led.

As the role involves working directly with young people who are often in full time education or working, it necessitates regular evening and weekend work for which TOIL will be granted.

The role also includes approximately I day a week to support wider FoES movement building work. This may include supporting the running of workshops, events and demonstrations, as well as helping ensure campaigns are planned and delivered with a strong focus on movement building. This will be supported and designed with the FoES Movement Building Lead.

Responsibilities

Managing the YFoES budget, with support from Line Manager.

Principal Accountabilities

- Work with Youth Engagement Intern to build and support a strong, diverse and inclusive YFoES network, with active members across Scotland.
- Lead on the design and delivery of events including education events, workshops and training, national and regional network gatherings, and residential weekends.

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- Develop educational resources including guides and booklets.
- Manage the YFoES budget, coordinating event related payments and volunteer reimbursements, with support from the FoES Movement Building Lead and admin team.
- Ensure a youth perspective is represented within FoES and engage young people in relevant FoES campaign moments and structures.
- Manage the YFoES social media channels, monthly newsletter and other communication channels, and create promotional materials.
- Support YFoES working groups and coordination group, attending meetings and assisting with administrative tasks where needed.
- Support other young activists across Scotland, such as attending events, providing resources and delivering relevant workshops.
- Build and hold relationships and regular communication with allied organisations, including Young FoE Europe network.
- Support FoES colleagues with the delivery of activism and movement building events where necessary.
- Support FoES campaign development and delivery where necessary.
- Work with operations colleagues to regularly review and improve FoES's safeguarding policies and practices.


Knowledge, skills and experience

Essential:

- At least one year's experience in an activism, education or youth work role – this can be voluntary or paid
- Demonstrable commitment to environmental and social justice as well as a commitment to challenging inequality and oppression
- Understanding of and enthusiasm for the aims of Young Friends of the Earth Scotland
- Ability to advocate for a youth perspective
- Experience of democratic, participative, and consensus-based working methods
- Experience of working with people from diverse backgrounds and communities
- Experience of working with and supporting activists and volunteers
- Experience of organising events and project management skills
- Ability to multi-task, set priorities, self-motivate, and manage time efficiently
- Excellent teamwork skills, whether working with FoES staff or groups of volunteers
- Strong oral communication and facilitation skills, with the ability to engage and inspire young people
- Good written communication skills, with experience of delivering and/or coordinating communications across a range of communication channels
- Knowledge of Microsoft Office suites (Word, PowerPoint, Excel) and strong IT skills

Desirable, not essential:

- Experience of managing budgets
- Experience facilitating, developing and delivering educational workshops and training.










Organisational Chart
